EVENTS:

DURATION - (by elimination) or last to hit the ground.

SPEED - (by elimination) or first to gross finish line.

DISTANCE - (by elimination) measured in a straight line.

TROPHIES or RIBBONS thru third place. Additional PRIZES for BEST model, BEST finist, and MOST UNUSUAL will be awarded. Each Plane must prove it can Fly.

This time we are going to defray expenses with a nominal entry fee of \$.50 per entry. I don't think that will break anyone and the trophies and ribbons aren't cheap.

"Builder of the year" awards are going to be given at the Christmas Dinner. Whether you win "MODEL OF THE MONTH" or not, your entry will be given points so we can determine:

- 1. BEST BUILDER

In light of the country's financial status, the club has undertaken a clean-up and beautifying project at the field. We feel it is our duty to take care of the great facility the city has provided.


Thanks also to the Dept. of Parks & Recreation and the Corps. of Engineers for their cooperation, thus far, in our endeavors.
