

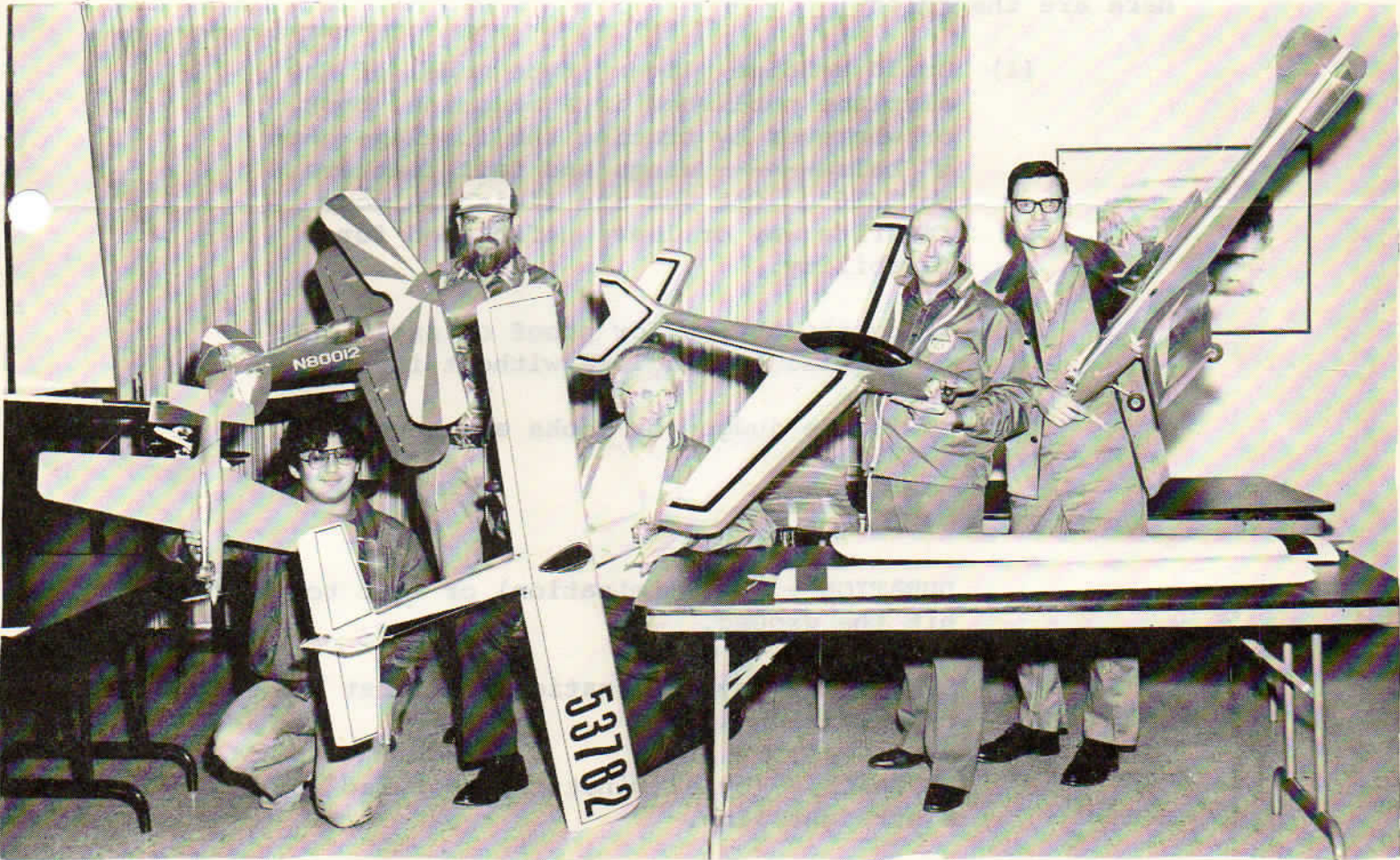

MODEL AIRPORT  
Safety Rules**

(Home of the "Valley Flyers R/C Club")

1. **NO** taking off from pit area—Observe A.M.A. safety rules
2. **NO** low passes or flying over crowds or pits
3. Take-offs and landings must be in the same direction, according to wind
4. All frequencies shall police themselves
5. **NO** flying over free flight or U-control areas
6. Pilots must stand adjacent to runway when flying
7. **NO** spectators allowed in roped-off areas
8. Clear Runways as soon as possible
9. Remove transmitter antenna when not flying
10. A.M.A. membership desired

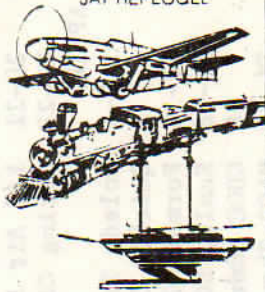

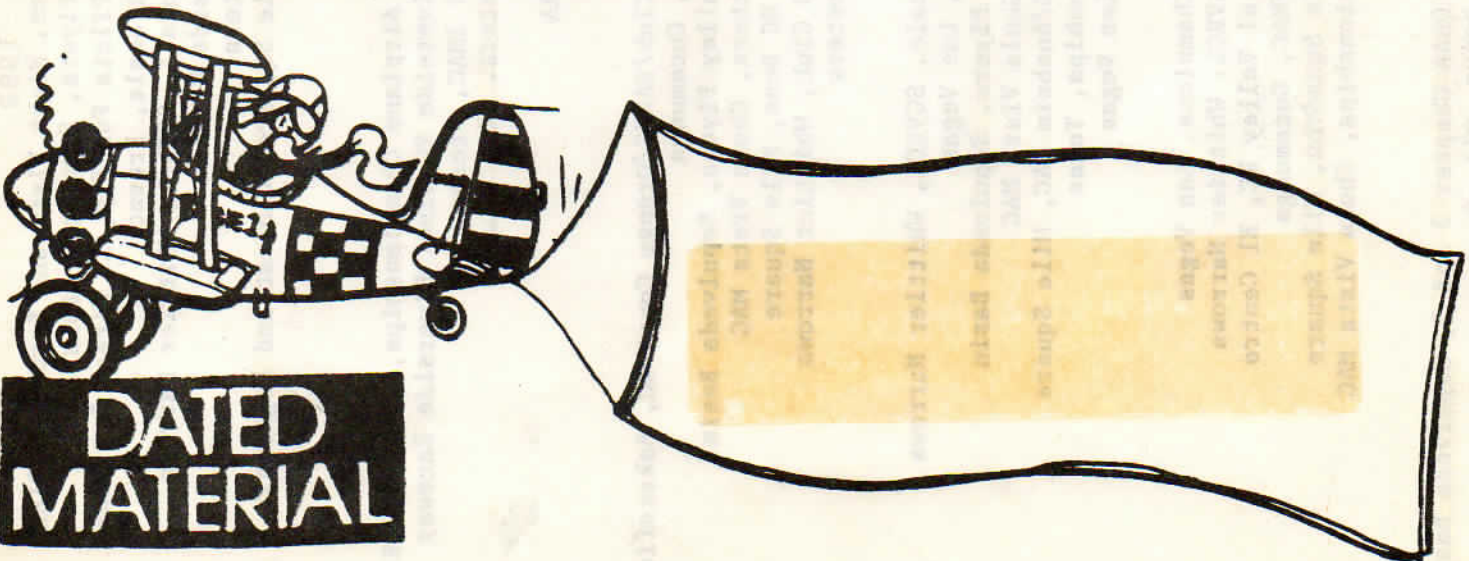
