

# UPDATE ON VALLEY FLYERS FOUNDATION

As those of you who were at the meeting know, earlier this year one of our members, Ken Tyler, proposed that the San Fernando Valley Radio-Controlled Flyers organize a foundation in order to collect tax-exempt donations for the maintenance of our airfield and for some other activities which could be described as charitable.

This matter was put to a vote of the members and approved.

As was announced at the last meeting, the Valley Flyers Foundation is now a legal reality and has been approved by the Secretary of State as an existing corporation. The Chairman of the Valley Flyers Foundation is Phil Mosko, our President. The President of Valley Flyers Foundation is Victor Martin. The Vice President is Walter Clark. The Secretary is Martin Mallow, and the Chief Financial Officer is Ken Turner.

After the formation of the Foundation, it was necessary to apply to the Franchise Tax Board of California for a tax exemption certification. In order to do this, we had to get estimates from contractors on what was needed to be done to the field. We secured those and have now made an application to the State for a tax exemption for the Valley Flyers Foundation. It appears almost certain that we will be able to get this. After the State has approved our application, we will apply to the Internal Revenue Service for a Federal Tax Exemption. When this is approved we will be in a position to solicit donations to the Valley Flyers Foundation, which will be deductible from the income tax of the person making the donation, as a deduction for any other charitable contribution would be.

Obviously, this will be of great assistance in raising money to improve and maintain our field. Since the Club is already setting aside money from its Treasury for the improvement of the field (in order to put in grass and sprinklers) it was decided at the last meeting of the Board to make a loan from the Club to the Valley Flyers Foundation of \$2,500. In this way, the Valley Flyers Foundation can put in the sprinklers and the grass and, if necessary, pay the money back to the Club when it receives donations, which are tax deductible.

The Valley Flyers Foundation will open a bank account in the Roscoe/Winnetka Branch of the Bank of America; a signature of both the President and the Chief Financial Officer will be required in order to withdraw any money.

If any of you have any questions regarding the Foundation or its activities, Ken Tyler will be at the next meeting of the San Fernando Valley Flyers Club to answer your questions.
