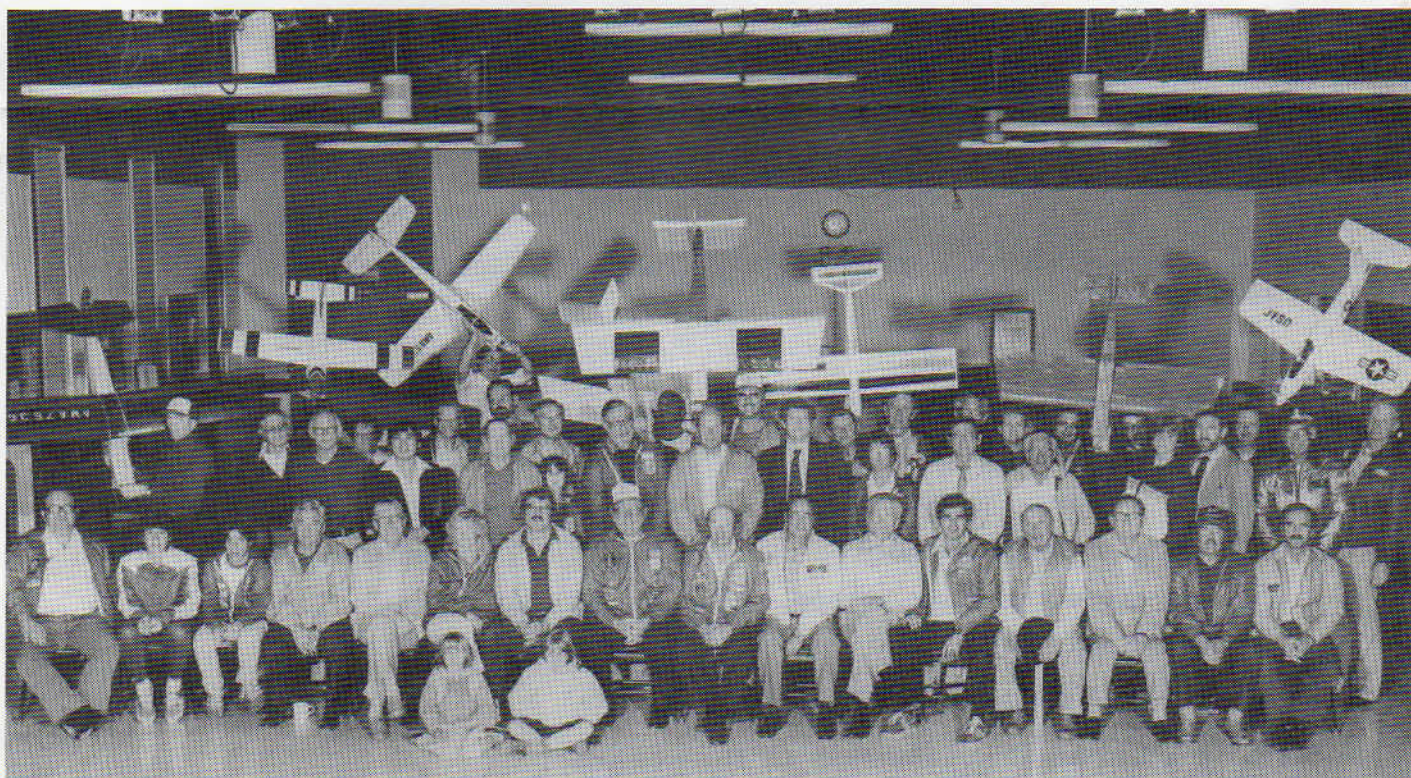

BOARD MEETING January 11, 1983

Present: Phil Mosko, Ken Turner, Vic Martin, Mel Gifis, Ken Tyler, Marv Zauss, Pete and Betty Olsen, Cindy and Elden Rice, Bob Neithart, and Joe Brassner.

Among many items of old business discussed were the fact that Ken Tyler has now received approval of our tax exemption status (see the letter on another page).

Discussion was held about raffles -- it is generally agreed that our idea of keeping all the stubs for use at the Christmas dinner was not as exciting as previously thought. After discussing lots of alternatives it was decided that monthly raffles will continue as the last few have (with prizes being numbered in advance) and the next Christmas dinner will find each person attending having one ticket for a "door prize". Mel Gifis has hopes of booking a banquet room for a Friday or Saturday and engaging a band of some sort -- this will allow dancing while dining and a weekend is preferable so most of us won't have to be up early the next day for work.

The Board agreed that we need to "enlist" people to help with telephoning, publicity, club property, etc. At our Jan. meeting we will bring this up and pray for volunteers.

Ken Turner gave the 1982 final Treasurer's Report -- it proved to be a fairly good year. The club made a profit of roughly \$230.00 on raffles and \$130.00 from the snack stand/meeting refreshments.

We will be looking into the possibility of starting a "Flight Training Course". We don't have a qualified chief instructor in mind yet but all agree it would be a great idea for new members and for soliciting membership.

Phil has contacted people to do the grading at the field -- work is expected to commence this weekend and should take about a month to complete.

About the new frequencies: We have learned that they are already being sold and Phil is making arrangements to accommodate them at the field. The poles with the current color (72 mhz) frequencies will remain and a new frequency will be added to each one. The 27 mhz series will be discontinued and new frequencies will replace them.

On the basis of the information submitted and provided your present operations continue unchanged or conform to those proposed in your application, you are exempt from state franchise or income tax under Section 23701d, Revenue and Taxation Code. Any change in operation, character or purpose of the organization must be reported immediately to this office so that we may determine the effect on your exempt status. Any change of name or address also must be reported.

You are required to file Form 199 (Exempt Organization Annual Information Return) or Form 199B (Exempt Organization Annual Information Statement) on or before the 15th day of the 5th month (4 1/2 months) after the close of your accounting period. See annual instructions with forms for requirements.

You are not required to file state franchise or income tax returns unless you have income subject to the unrelated business income tax under Section 23731 of the Code. In this event, you are required to file Form 109 (Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return) by the 15th day of the 5th month (4 1/2 months) after the close of your annual accounting period.

If the organization is incorporating, this approval will expire unless incorporation is completed with the Secretary of State within 60 days.

Exemption from federal income or other taxes and other state taxes requires separate applications.

This exemption effective as of August 5, 1982.
