

Should the number of flyers on the flight line be limited? Most flyers will only fly if they are comfortable with the situation. Just because it it a person's turn does not mean he has to fly.

Joe Brassner is making mine stands for our transmitters. There will be a stand at the side of each frequency marker. When a flyer gets to his area, he will place his transmitter and flag on the stand. There will be no transmitters in the pit area. This should eliminate the problem of the transmitter being turned on by accident.

The rain has slowed the progress on the field. We will again be able to get started as soon as the field dries.

Per our discussion about a workshop for building problems, feel free to bring your problem to the meeting and we will get you the help you need.

I see many new faces at the field. Let's all do some P.R. work and get these people to join our club.

One last word on safety. Please—when you see someone in your area with small kids let them know they are not allowed on the flight line at all and should be very careful in the pit area. We don't want any accidents.
