One coat just about filled all the plywood grain, it dries fast. and sands better than K&B epoxy primer. I painted over it with K&B epoxy paint and there absolutely no problems. Im convinced!!! Im going to try it on my next plane, which will be covered with super coverite and will let you know the results.

At the last meeting, we had a session scheduled for those who needed help with problems. Well I guess no one has any problems, because no one showed up. We will try one more time. After the March meeting is over (approx.9:30 pm) anyone with problems is encouraged to stick around and we will try to help. Then Turner

At the February meeting, Ken Turner brought up that the A.M.A. has given us the opportunity to start a Show Team. Little interest was shown at the meeting, and the Board discuss the idea that possibly the very title is frightening to some members who are capable of joining this group.

After reading the documents presented, I'm going to try to put some minds at rest and, hopefully, encourage more members to want to participate.

First of all, the whole idea of the team is to help eliminate the "toy airplane" image we have with the general public. The way I read it, most of the "stunts" performed by the team can be accurately done by any pilot who has been flying solo for approximately six months. The following is a list of the things mentioned in the information the A.M.A. sent:

- 1. Demonstration of controls (elevator, rudder, aileron, throttle, etc)
- 2. Simple manuevers (figure 8, rolls, Immelmann, etc.)
 - 3. A powered sailplane (showing the ability to float)
 - 4. Aerobatic demonstration (bi-plane or pattern ship doing 4 or 8 point rolls, etc.)
 - 5. A dog fight (between Attackers or Ugly Sticks)

There are, of course, some specialized stunts that only a truly skilled pilot can perform, but the first three items can easily be performed by over half our members; the last two could be performed by at least 10 that I know of.

Another thing that may have been discouraging is the mention of the amount of time involved. The documents state "a lot of dedication is involved". This is definitely true. The Board feels that if highly technical manuevers are to be performed the pilot should be able to practice every weekend. The documents give the following explanation: "Those whose family or job responsibilities take them out of town during practice sessions or shows, as well as modelers who regularly fly the contest circuit should not be included on the team."

Now let's go on to the balance of the team. If there are four pilots, there must be a "team manager and an announcer". The team manager would be in charge of the following:

- 1. Organization recruitment & selection of members, assigning building projects, setting up practice sessions & shows
- Correspondence reports to AMA, membership lists, show reports, uniform requests, equipment orders, publicity materials, etc.
- 3. Finances establishing expense charges for sponsors, quoting, billing, and collecting money, etc.
- 4. Planning choreographing each show, sheeduling people to appear, etc.
- 5. Safety review sites for adequacy of space, location of flight line, crowd control, etc.
- 6. Publicity meeting with prospective show spnsors, providing materials for radio, TV, newspapers, etc.
- 7. Show Participation setting up technical apparatus, props, etc.
- 8. Equipment ordering maintaining adequate supplies of fuel, props, etc.
- 9. Special effects & Sound systems oversees the selection and production of materials for tapes, etc. used with the show scenario.

10. Trip planning - if a trip of more than one day is indicated, manager arranges for housing, meals, special transportation, etc.

The team announcer is the team's mouthpiece; the one who tells the public what the team is all about and what modeling is all about (the prime reason for the team's existence). He need not be a 'comic' but must be a quick thinker. He should have the ability to ad-lib when necessary. (Almost all of you have that ability). He need not be a great flyer, but should be well informed on all facets of aeromodeling and be able to deliver his commentary in terminology the general public will understand.

It is extremely important that the announcer describe what is happening accurately, and that he explains the mechanics of the aircraft to promote a favorable impression of the sport/hobby of aeromodeling.

An important item the A.M.A. seems to skim over in their document ation is the need for volunteers, helpers, etc. This group includes pit crews, assistance, and the usual people we use at a race. The Board feels that we would need a "one on one" helper for ezch pilot in addition to the others. This gives nearly everyone in the club the opportunity to join in and be part of this Show Team:

Team Members are described by the A.M.A. should meet the following:

- 1. Have the ability to work well with others
- 2. Possess good sportsmanship qualities
 - 3. Have a pleasant personality
- 4. Reflect loyalty in past commitments

- 5. Have proficiency in the area for which he/she is being selected
- 6. Reflect perseverance
- 7. Have family support and understanding of the time he/she must put forth
- 8. Have past contributions to local club efforts
- 9. Have the willingness to forego contests to appear in shows

I sincerely hope this has enlightened you and helped to ease any doubts you may have had about your ability to become part of the Show Team. Now that 99% of you have realized that you are qualified for the team let's see some spirit and talk to someone on the Board about getting "our" show going.

Don't forget that we will have a workshop for members having trouble building after the meeting (app. 9:30). The meeting is March 22, 1983 at 8:00 P.M. at the Encino Community Center.

Our Forth Annual Arm Powered Contest will be taking up most of the evening so there will be $\underline{\text{NO}}$ Show and Tell this month.

As you probably know the Quickie 500 scheduled for March 10th. was cancelled due to the weather. The race has been re-scheduled for April 10th. and the Fun Fly scheduled for April 17th. has been cancelled.




