

### **RADIOS AND FREQUENCIES**

Well how about all those new frequencies and radios and A.M. or F.M.? Almost every month now one or more of the radio columns are reporting about interference of one kind or another. I strongly suggest that you read these columns carefully and if you have any questions I will be happy to discuss them at the meeting, the field or give me a call on the phone (818 881-1058). I will make this short by saying that if I were to buy a new radio now on the standard R/C frequencies it would be one that was F.M. and had a double conversion receiver. What is called by most manufactures THE 1991 RECEIVER is what I am referring to. One of the big problems is that A.M. is still being used and sold. It appears that A.M. and F.M. are not compatable. Those of you that are buying A.M. equipment will have an obsolete radio in a few years.

As you may have noticed the field has been restriped. The pilot boxes have been redone so that there is tweleve feet between them. Please stand in the area with the yellow stripe. Move forward for takeoffs and landings and move back to fly. Let me warn you NEVER TAXI YOUR PLANE SO THAT ANOTHER TRANSMITTER IS BETWEEN YOU AND IT!!!!!!!!! is possible to lose control and have an accident. It has happened.

Mr. Mallow,

This is in reference to your letter of August 14, 1985 regarding the use of radio frequencies to operate remote-controlled model aircraft.

The use of the amateur frequency bands for the operation and control of such devices is permitted under Section 97.99 of the FCC Rules and Regulations. However, an amateur radio license is required if these frequencies are used. Section 97.61 gives a complete breakdown of the frequency bands authorized for amateur use.

An amateur radio license is not required, however, if you operate your model aircraft on frequencies assigned to the Radio Control Radio Service. These frequencies are outlined in Section 95.207.

If you do not have a current copy of the FCC Rules and Regulations, the information I have enclosed will help you obtain one.




