Balanced Use of Apollo field

Hopefully, this will be the final chapter of the "balanced use of Apollo Field" saga. I'm happy to report that the Valley Flyers Board approved criteria/goals for the scheduling of events for 2002. As you know, the goals are intended to provide a balanced weekend use of Apollo Field between the general flying public and the 3 Valley flying clubs. These goals also recognize the importance of club events in promoting model aviation and establishing safe and courteous flying procedures. The criteria/goals are delineated below.

- 1. Events should be spread out so that no more than 2 events are held in any one month.
- The number of days the field is closed should be less than scheduled for 2001.

- 3. Contest directors should minimize the hours that the field is closed to the general public to that which is necessary to support the event. When only a few participants are practicing, the field should remain open unless there are safety issues. For 3-day events, the field shall be closed no earlier than noon on the first day.
- 4. The number of "3" day events should be limited to no more than 3 per year.
- Events requiring AMA membership for participation should encourage on the spot AMA application to expand event participation. Applicants must of course still satisfy event/aircraft requirements.
- 6. Events should be posted at the field at least one month in advance of the scheduled dates.

Consider combining some of the VF and Giant Scale fun flys (this is a new addition to the criteria previously e-mailed to Board members).

The 2002 schedule that meets the intent of these goals was fully coordinated among the 3 clubs by Barry Leavengood and approved by the Board. This schedule will be reported in other sections of the Newsletter.

P-51 Ride

At last month's meeting 17 club members signed up for a change to win a free ride in Kevin LaRossa's beautiful P-51. Those of you that are interested in this opportunity but haven't signed up yet may do so at either the October or November club meetings. Only one sign up per person is permitted. To be eligible, club members must meet age and safety requirements established by Kevin. These limitations are as follows: at least 18 years old; weigh less than 250 lbs.; be able to climb unassisted in an out of the cockpit. The latter restriction requires a certain amount of agility to climb up the main landing gear strut to the wing and then climb over the fuselage side into the cockpit. Participants will be provided a free, non-transferable lottery ticket at the club meetings. The wining ticket will be drawn in December. The Club Board will contact Kevin and the winner to establish a mutually agreeable date for the flight. Photographers and Board members as well as the winner's family (if desired) will be present to celebrate and document the occasion. Interested and qualified members can sign up for the lottery ticket by seeing Bob Joyce at the regular Club meetings.

Field Rage

It is amazing how quickly a person can go from beautiful day, life is good to brain seizing rage. Perhaps it is because the reasons surrounding the incident I will soon describe are those I have been fighting for behind the scenes for over a year.



I had been out of town for a couple of weeks and finally this past week I had a chance to clear neural pathways and have my fingers begin to remember that they, more or less, know how to fly. It was early afternoon, a beautiful not too hot sunny day. I walked comfortably out into the North end field spooled up and took off. A moment later coming about straight at me, 10 feet off to my right and about 15 feet off the ground was some kind of electric aircraft. I was pretty startled and after regaining control of my heli into a hover I yelled as loud as I could. I landed in time to watch someone from the middle of the infield now bank left across the main runway, left again heading North, another left and then again make a pass right through my airspace. I was livid.

I squared my heli up on the ground and walked over to have a conversation. Voice definitely raised I asked him to keep his aircraft out of my airspace. His reply was "leave me alone it is only a little electric". Wrong answer. I went back and finished my flight and later in the pits found him and asked if he had any sense of rules, courtesy, or safety? His only defense was the rules were "my opinion only". Again, wrong answer. I found myself screaming at him for a short while eliciting "ok, I get it, I won't fly when you're around." I walked away. Two things: This was one grade "A" nimrod. And, my reaction was over the top.

Just like road rage, we have too many people using too few resources. When one person does something incorrect there is a potential it will really push someone's buttons. I was discussing my reaction with friend and he added a similar story in a different context. We realized the reaction was correct, in fact appropriate, but disproportionate. I acted as if the worst case scenario had actually occurred. Hmm.


Ricc Bieber, Program Director, introduced long-time model aviation hobbyist, hobby shop owner and Valley Flyer member, Tony Nacarato.




