Safety Views

Experienced Tims sometimes are known to just flaunt the rules because "right now its safe to break the rules." Examples: flying gliders and electrics in the infield and more than one pound electrics in the electric area. Comments such as: "We would be in the way if we flew in the right place" (with a 4 pound electric), or "screw the no glider rule, its a public park." Apparently these Tims don't care



that the flying areas have been separated for safety reasons. There is no flying close to the pits to try to keep the flying out of the pits. The electric area is close to engine break-in and the North end of the pits. The likelihood of injury by a one-pound foamy is very small, but how would you like 4 pounds of batteries and balsa hitting you in the face as you are taxiing your 20-pound monster toward the flight line with a hand on the throttle? Then having to explain to someone's widow why 20 pounds and 5 horsepower got away. The rules are to be followed no matter what the conditions as they are designed to maximize safety.

Lately, I have observed a Tim or two plant balsa amongst weeds and then take a long leisurely walk diagonally across the runway to recover anything left that can be further abused. If you have to cross the runway, walk behind the pilots until you can runway cross the

straight across. Before you put foot to runway, make sure everyone flying knows you are "ON THE RUNWAY." Then scurry across as fast as your hot, tired old body can take you (picture cockroaches when the lights are turned on). If your plane is close to or on the runway, do what should have been done to Princess Di, scoop and run. You can analyze the mess back in the pits, so there is no need to remain in the danger zone making sure the battery is off. It will recharge a lot faster than you will recover.

It was gratifying to see members take the initiative during the last race to keep casual visitors behind the fence. Also the racers pitted South. During the Howard Reed, a wingless torpedo left its wing at pylon 3, screamed between the members of a family including a preschool girl and hit the fence about midway up the North pits. At the prior race in the spring, the remains of a plane cleared the trees and came down between two trucks in the parking lot. Next race, you might wisely decide to park your vehicle and yourself near the Johns. This advice does not apply when the formation flying warbird Tims are making the infamous s**t house turns.

When you see someone obviously new, offer to mentor them. They feel better and the field is safer. Try to be nice, and maybe you will find a new dues payer. We had an example of a budding Tim a while back who put up a flag and refused to take it down. After all, the clerk selling him the radio system told him that the frequency "was his."


