Safety Views

When discussing radios and their respective ranges at the field this past month, I was told by fellow flyers that some of the pilots often experience "hits" or "glitches" when flying. As I inquired more on this, I found that it is the occasional "newbie" turning on a transmitter without checking frequency use first. I subsequently found that many of the "glitches" are due to pilot set up error or not understanding the necessity for the long antenna wire.

What I observed on many occasions was the creative ways pilots can set up the antennas on their aircraft receivers by shortening their effective range by twisting and knotting their antennas to avoid the unsightly dangling antenna wire out the back of their airplane.

Please remember that twisting and knotting a long antenna wire can greatly decrease the actual receiver range effectiveness and potentially cause your aircraft to crash when it gets too far away. Many of our hobby shops carry special lightweight Base Loaded short antennas that will meet receiver specifications and still meet the demands of all of us hobbyists to keep our aircraft looking sharp.

Cheers to all of the Valley Flyers who reached out and made connections by helping and connecting with flyers who are not club members...yet.

Gene Sidwell brought in his Sig Kadet LT-40 Trainer. He says it fly's real nice.



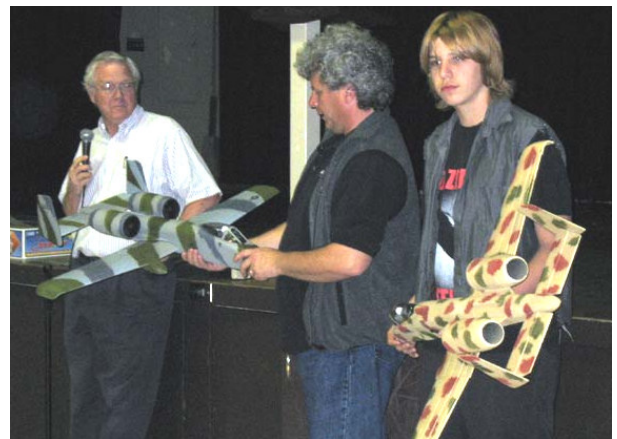
Stephen Fine brought in his E-Sky Honey Bee 2 electric helicopter.

Board Meeting Minutes of February 1, 2005

Meeting was called to order by George Finch at: 7:19 PM

In Attendance were: **George Finch, Ed Gappell, Vic Schneidau, Sam Gengo, Bill Bolin, Dave Hendrex, Bob Tarlau, Stephen Fine, Ron Brawders. Special Guest: Harvey Elmes.** Absent: Bob Wiikari, Mike Lipsey, Chuck Gould, Christian Stoehr, Jason Pakfar, Patrick Ashour.

Some general discussions of the "Energy Absorbers" and the height to be determined. Thoughts that the amount of concrete and space planned to be used to sink the attachment poles may be overkill.

One pilot pad will be fitted with an example absorber. The wheel-chair friendly pads **not** to be used for the example.

Some discussions of the "signs." The thought is that they may have been already printed and are only awaiting to be posted by the city. Stay tuned...

Dave Hendrex may have some possible conflicts with the schedule. Will check into them before next meeting.

Dave would like to have 1 foot square footers of concrete put in for the Half-A course pylons.

Ed Gappell to run Food Stand for an event. Need to verify cooking gas available – we are thought to have approximately three bottles full.

Next Club Meeting, Harvey will bring in an AirCruiser. Presentation will consist of the airplanes used in races and some pointers and tips for racing them from various people.

Helicopters: Bill reported that Chris (Christian Stoehr) spoke with Curtis Youngblood about making it to the Labor Day Classic.

The VF Foundation will make up the cost of three shade structures for the Electric Flying Area. Approximately \$1400.

Sam Gengo to look into cushioning for the concrete pilot pads at the runways similar to what they have at Whittier Narrows. While he was met with the usual amount of resistance to change, he feels that it would not only make standing on the pilot pads more comfortable and healthier, but would encourage modelers to actually stand **on** the pads instead of in between them or off to one side.

Preliminary research finds the price of cushioning at about \$30-40 per pad, give or take. Compared to costs of such things as shade stands or multiple 10s of thousands of dollars for runways and painted taxiways, the cost would be in the 'noise level' of club expenditures.

Bob Tarlau – Membership is at 69 current / paid applications as of this meeting. Total of 174 names currently on the Valley Flyers roster. The Boy Scouts to cook hot dogs at some of the coming events this year. Actual events staffed by the Scouts to be worked out.

Bob plans to begin introducing new members with a brief write-up in his Membership Memo column of the newsletter. We can learn a bit of insight to new members as they come on board.

Having an assistant starter out at the line during a race is a good idea for safety.

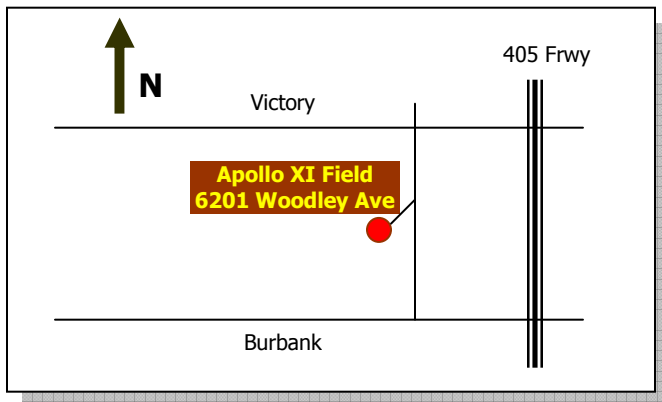
