Hello fellow flyers. Its that time of year again when everyone is out at the field with their brand new planes, helis and equipment. With that being said, it is noticeable that there are new faces around the flying field along with all the experienced pilots. It is easy for any of us to get caught up in the moment and forget about pre-flight checks so that we can be flying as quickly as one can upon arrival to the field; often flying in the wrong in the area. Please remember to fly in the areas as follows: All helis are to fly at the South end of the field.

Electric airplanes weighing a pound or less are to fly from the North end of the field. Lastly, any power and electric aircraft weighing more than a pound are to take off from the runway. Should you have an airplane that weighs a pound or more and needs to be hand launched, you can do this from one of the pilot pads. Please help to redirect those who are flying in a wrong area to make all of our flying experiences safe and sane.
