With the upcoming Valley Flyers "LA Jets" event on April 1st and 2nd, this months meeting will feature our jet set members latest projects. If you are interested in this running with this fast moving crowd, this is a meeting you won't want to miss. Jason Pakfar, our Director of Jets has an interesting program planned with a preview of some of these interesting and detailed models that will be flying on April 1. In spite of the event date, this is no joke. Jason and CD Bob Wilcox will be looking for workers to help with the event. Field Manager Dave Sweaney is working on a prototype energy absorber that will initially be installed at the field, on one of the pads at the flightline. Those who fly at other fields (Condor Field for one has something like this) may be familiar with the arrangement. It will be a PVC frame with webbing, and is intended to reduce or prevent injuries to pilots from aircraft that are a little more than off target. The plan is to prototype the design on a single pilot pad, and later to possibly set one up at each pilot station. Dave is also working on adding the finishing touches to the Electric Area. We will hear more on these projects from Dave as they develop.?

Spring is almost here and there are lots of events coming up. The second race in our Multi-Club-Five-Race-Series is coming up this Sunday, March 26th at Whittier Narrows. Classes include .40 sized Trainer, Bridi Aircruiser, HOB/Global AT-6, and Slo-Quicke. This race is sponsored and staffed by the San Gabriel Valley Radio Control League. ## Rotors & Motors

Hi everybody. I'd like to re-introduce myself. After an absence of a little more than three years, it is my pleasure to again be on the board of the Valley Flyers as the helicopter director.



I started flying helis at the Basin in 1997. Several years later, I was invited to join the board. This was a pretty dynamic time. It was in 2000 that plans were originally being solidified to reallocate much of the field to what it is today. Helicopters were to be moved from the north end of the field to the south, first requiring a new control line circle to be built in the parking lot-delicate and interesting negotiations.

Once this move was made, the heli pilots had much more room and importantly, we moved rotor craft activity out from behind the backs of fixed wing pilots at the main flight line. There have been growing pains

of course, but it is more unusual now for there to be flagrant crossing of airspace. It is not perfect, but I remember in the span of one month, two airplanes crashing within fifteen feet of where I was flying, a jet belly landing *across* the heli's area, and an airplane/helicopter mid-air. Incidents like these are not nearly as common today.

In addition, a new space for "park flyers" was created, and the CL guys are probably overall happier with their two circles in the parking lot than having the use of the south circle and near constant conflicts with r/c aircraft.

During these years, helicopters started to boom. The quality of equipment and electronics increased, and the costs naturally came down. It is not the least expensive r/c hobby, but for an understandable amount of money, a person can get something quite flyable. We've also had events. September 1999 was the very first Los Angeles 3-D Helicopter Classic; today, we are planning the 7<sup>th</sup>.

I enjoyed this time immensely. It was very rewarding to be able to directly affect many aspects of "The Field" where I spent so much of my free time. My work schedule however, got in the way, and for a while, I needed to take a step back.

So what is next?

Currently, there are several heli items I will try to address. One is to always improve the pit area I also want to work out where small electric helis should be flying. The entire grass area south of the pits is a no-fly zone; electric are flying there now illegally (according to AMA regulations). I want to explore if this area could be used if we were at least east of the pit line.

Finally, I want to confront one of my biggest frustrations from my previous stint on the board – *none of the heli guys are members of the club*. As such, they never saw the 30 or so newsletter articles I wrote between December 2000 and December 2003. These were important years and many of these were important articles (most are archived at [www.valleyflyers.com](http://www.valleyflyers.com)). Many of the guys feel they fly in a vacuum that is not really connected to the rest of the park. A lot of this is simply because they have no idea what any of the issues are. I want to begin changing this. Towards this end, besides talking to people, I am going to start posting copies of these articles in the helicopter pits, so people can begin seeing themselves as part of a larger community.
