Deviating from that will simply bring more regulations and restrictions which I am strongly opposed to. Please stay within your designated areas. Also electric planes over 16 oz will need to use the runway for any flying activity.

Just 26 out of 104 weekend days in 2007 are scheduled for organized events involving restricting the public flying to those who are registered participants of the event. This is 25% of the year's weekend days. Everyone, of course, is invited and welcome to come out to these events and participate, especially in the "Fun Fly" days. For some of the electric guys, Helis, jets, scale pilots, and racers, you'll be already involved with your specific events so the number of weekend days affected will be even less for you!

While these "field improvement dates" may seem, at first glance, to subtract from your sport flying days, they can actually add to your year's flying and fun. If you've never raced, for example, come to a Slo-Quickie/Trainer race and you only need to complete 8 laps to everyone else's 10. How can you lose? It sounds easy until you try it! But it *is* possible for a first-timer to take away some points or even a trophy! We have a mixture of

Trainer races as well as the much faster Q40 races including the annual <u>Howard Reed Memorial</u> on June 23rd and 24th.

And if the thrill of racing your own plane doesn't bode well, come out and watch a race and you'll most likely get to witness a few high-speed, midair crashes. There's nothing like the sight and sound of two quickies going 150+ mph smacking into each other around a pylon! Even sans midairs, the racing itself can be a thrill for spectators. This year we will be utilizing a new light board so everyone will see the "cuts" as soon as they are recorded. Less guess-work, fairer racing, and more spectator involvement, so be there!

The SAE AeroDesign West event this year will bring college students from all over the world to compete in a nation-wide competition held each year in the East and West of the US. We are fortunate to be selected as the 2007 West Coast host of this fun-to-watch event. This year, over 40 teams from as many different universities from throughout the United States, Canada, South America, Europe, Asia, and as far reaching as Australia, have registered so far. They will be bringing original scratch-built designs of their own to fly around the pattern while sporting payloads of competitive amounts of weights, up to 55 pounds! Mark you calendars for March 24th and 25th for a wild weekend of weightlifting. For the Jet guys, we have several different LA Jets meets this year including a one-day too-cold & windy-for-mostof-us-to-fly-anyway November Autumn Classic. The "Fall Classic," of course, being the World Series. The other dates to come out and watch some of the most amazing jet powered models in the world are the weekends of May 19 and August 4th and 5th. Bring your turbine, ducted fan, pusher prop... or just bring you camera! Remember the public will be invited to step in to look around during the static display and judging so don't forget your close-up lens!

The Rotor Wing folks have their usual <u>Labor Day Classic</u> as well as some clinics and BBQs of their own that don't affect the fixed-wing RC folk. The control line events are such that they will only affect the Helicopters on a minimal number of days. Please be aware of the schedule in advance to a trip to the field so that you will know what to expect for that day's events. Please allow the group on the schedule to have the space if needed. We also have some all-electric events on the plan. With the newer power plants, we've seen recently that this does not necessarily mean smaller in size of aircraft. It is quite awesome to see a giant-scale doing acrobatics on a brushless outrunner!

The <u>Scale Masters Qualifiers</u> on August 18th and 19th will be open for expert as well as those who want to sport or fun-fly some scale routines and maneuvers. It will be a fun day for those who wish to participate as well as those who just want to watch. Again, some amazing aircraft will be on display and in flight. Don't miss it!

I hope that everyone has a great 2007 and can come out and participate in these events as well as get out to the field flying with as many landings as you have takeoffs. Remember, the organized events translate into field improvements that we all enjoy and can make use of. The smoother parking lot, electric charging station, wind-sock, blue work tables, and continued improvements in the park-flyer area are some of the 2006 perks just to name a few. We have many more in store for 2007 so come out and support the hobby by supporting the events!


