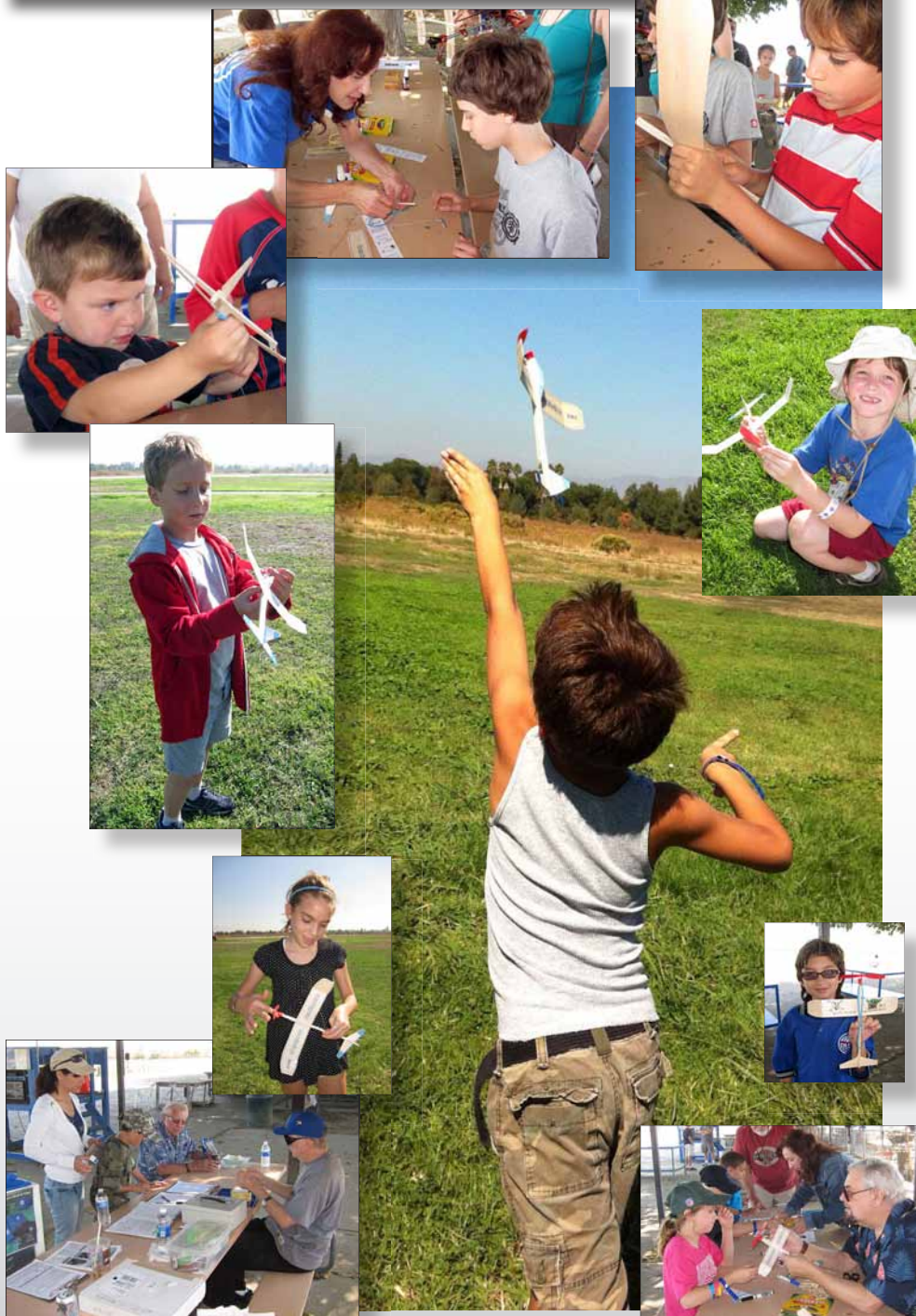

Another up point is that we had more chicken than planned, due to an error while taking the order. This helped feed all those un-registered members!

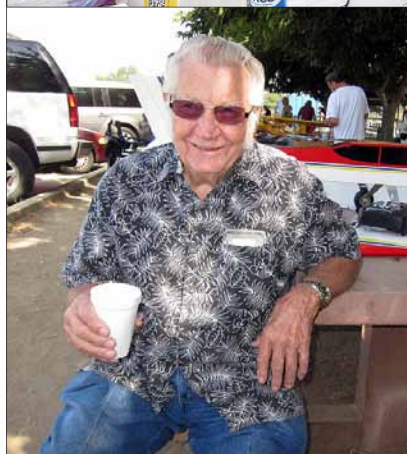

Ricc is also contacting a Boy Scout troop. Chuck will work out meal tickets. Bob Smith has ordered more wrist bands. Jason Pakfar will bring 3 monitors. Scott Ramos can bring a computer and simulator. Chuck has requested Sky Streaks from the AMA. If not, Jason will donate 100.

Randy Mytar suggests that he brings a helium balloon with a 400' tether to a future event. Also he recommended that we add an altimeter to a trainer and have a contest to see who can get the closest to 400' without going over. Randy gave Jason the City and State code for non smoking in parks.

Ricc is concerned on how the low number of dishes for the pot luck there were. Very few people brought items for the potluck.

LA3D Helicopter Event

Artwork is done. The registration is \$25 for two days, \$15 for 1. Dave Tarlau is working on getting factory demos. Dave is also working on getting vendor participation. He already has a couple lined up. Jason will update LA3D.org website. Dave will provide content. Dave will need assistance with setup, security and registration.

The following event is the Fun-Fly and Swap Meet on Nov. 5th, and then LA Jets on Nov 27th and Toys for Tots on Dec 11.

We have not set a date or venue for the holiday party. Last year we had it on the 10th. We will plan for the 10th or the 17th at El Presidente at Devonshire and Reseda. As soon as the venue is confirmed, we can start advertising.

AMA Expo

They are already signing up booths. We will participate this year again. The cost is \$125 per space. We will book 3 spaces. The 2012 applications are done. Chuck has asked Cliff Sonnentag to do the 2012 member card artwork.

Bob has provided the Board with the first preliminary 2012 events calendar. The scale events are too close together. The Giant Scale events are open to all scales, so Chuck recommends the name Giant Scale event should be renamed to All Scale. Bob Tarlau asked about coordinating the schedule with Circle Burners. Bob will contact Sam Gengo to see if he will CD the SAE event. We need to make sure that we don't have events on holidays. We need to flip the Western States with the Western Championship. We may want to cut out one scale events and perhaps have a 3D event or another electric event. Tentative date for a second electric event will be the 9th of Sept. Ben will CD. We need to talk to Hobby People about paid ads in the newsletter.

Chuck, Randy and Bob discussed the runway repairs and it should be scheduled for mid Nov. We have \$21,463.03 in the Foundation, we may look to get some more work done than just the runway. It would be nice to get the taxiways done at the same time, depending on costs. Chuck has started listing items from the Dave Hendrics donation on Ebay. We have made about \$1,200 so far.

There were a number of other items discussed at the meeting with the Parks and Recs. such as the restrooms, mowing and some brush removal and communications with other clubs and movie shoots.

Glendale Field.

Jason should be picking up the

keys for the Glendale on the 5th. Jason recommends the first order of business is the construction of the shade structure and pit.

The Valley Flyers PayPal account is properly functioning. Chuck has supplied Bob Smith with the information.

Chuck spoke with Dave Hendrics, he is doing better and is able to do some reading with a magnifying glass and his health overall is good. Dave said he is satisfied with the way his donation is being handled.

A tentative date of Oct 11th and 12th from 8 to noon has been set for replacing the table tops in the pits. We may consider adding more tables. We also need to consider making it more clear that the tables are only for assembling their planes and not for pitting.

We have been working on get-



ting the updated 2012 applications.

Efforts on the field repairs have been going. **Bob Tarlau, Ran-**

dy Mytar, and Chuck Thompson met with Parks and Recs. Chuck had not ever been involved in dealing with the parks and give his thanks Bob for his initiative on taking the lead with the ongoing communications with Parks. Topics being discussed include the runway repairs, movie shoots, mowing, restroom maintenance and more. We will be able to move forward with the runway repair. If all goes well, we should be able to get the Right of Access, and we are shooting for the work to be done in November. We will also look into get the taxi ways done at the same time, if cost and scheduling works out. We talked about the restrooms and the poor condition of the port-a-pottys. This isn't the only restroom down in the park and they are looking to resolve the problem

After this meeting and the Master Plan meeting, it's clear they are walking a tight rope with all the interests of the many groups that use the park, There are also outside groups that want to use the park for events.

After seeing what they are going though, Chuck has a better understanding and appreciation the difficulties that the reduced staff at parks deals with.

One area where there is the most difficulty is overnight camping. The problem is that the Corps does not want any overnight camping in the basin and there have been a lot of other groups who want to, so it is difficult for them to allow us and not others.

They will do a walk around of the field with us next week

New tabletops have been purchased for the 10 metal tabletops.

We have a new Newsletter Editor **Ted Mayer**. Welcome Ted. We have a new Media Director, **Tony Aguila**. **Mike Trudell** has stepped down as a Helicopter Director. **Dave Tarlau** is helping out but his college studies prevents him from becoming the Helicopter Director

Sammy of Sammy's cameras has donated a plane to the club. Sammy also donated a 33% CAP a couple of weeks ago. We will be arranging a sale.

Jason Pakfar

Jason went to the field with the chief and performed a test flight with a glow and electric plane. Today, all the paperwork was completed. We anticipate having keys to the field by the end of the week. We have been working for 4 years with over 40 meetings. **Greg Gregorian**, a member of Valley Flyers and on the Glendale Water Commission was instrumental in moving it forward. The former club had 80 members at it's height, and ended with under 50. This is not a public park. You will have to be an AMA and a club member to use the facilities once opened. We are still working on structuring the prices, access and rules. We will have port-a-pottys on site and have to do our own maintenance of the grounds. The field is only 1/2 to 1/3 the size of the basin field. It will handle planes up to about 40, maybe 60 size with standard engines. We are working on getting a container. For now, we can run a generator, We will need to build a shade structure like the one we

built for the park flyer area. We should start off making it useable and then see how it goes before making major improvements and place any stress on our existing facilities and operations at the basin. We will need to have new Bylaws to meet the requirements of the city of Glendale. We have not talked to the City about restrooms. We have started conversations with Water and Power about eventually bringing both water and power to the new field. We may also be able to use some recycled water.

The Gardening Dept had been using it to dump dirt. The city came out and leveled the area. There is some vegetation that will need to be cleared. There was a question about non AMA member use of the field. The field will only be accessed by members and member guests. A committee will need to be formed to start up the new field. The City of Glendale insisted that their name is included, so the club will be known as the Glendale flyers. We will still need to figure out how to control the gate and use of the field.

Thank you Jason for all the work you have done to bring this to fruition

It's amazing how we are start-

ing a new field when so many clubs are losing fields. **Chuck Thompson** belongs to a club that you get a key and the key is changed every year and everyone has to have a club ID on them while at the field. Show and tell

Chuck got a Great Planes Fokker DR1. He had his maiden flight it on Sunday.

Randy Mytar brought in an Extra from Skyshark he got at a hobby shop in Lake Havasu. With a 6 cell battery it weighs 7 pounds. He finds that with an electric there is more throttle management than with glow. Consequently, after about 6 minutes he's ready to land. He did his own trim design. The plane is read to maiden.

These beautiful watercolor paintings are art prints approx. 24"x30".

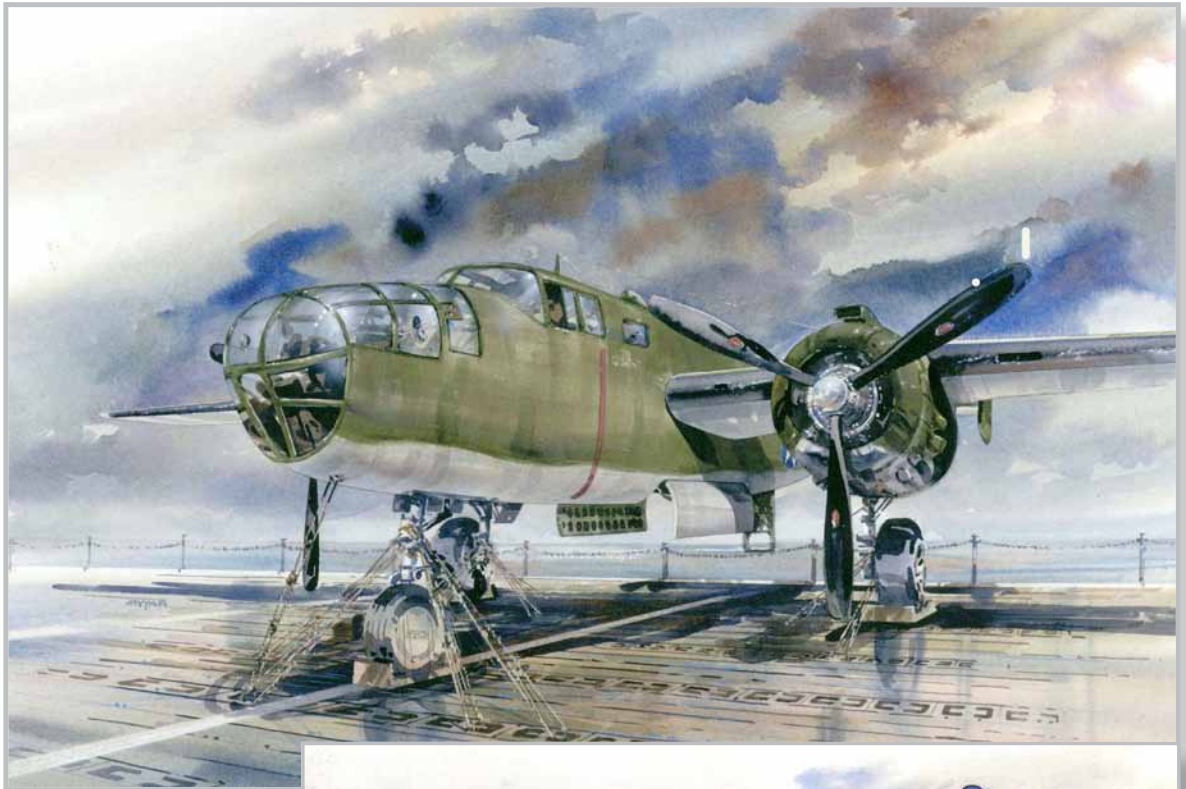
The price is \$150 of which \$50 will go to the club.

The New Glendale Field

We received the final signature for us to take over the Glendale Field. The effort is 4 years in the making. Jason started to look into it, and has been working on behalf of the Valley Flyers.

The field is on the east of Hwy 2 between the 134 and the 210. and is next to the Glendale Sports Complex.

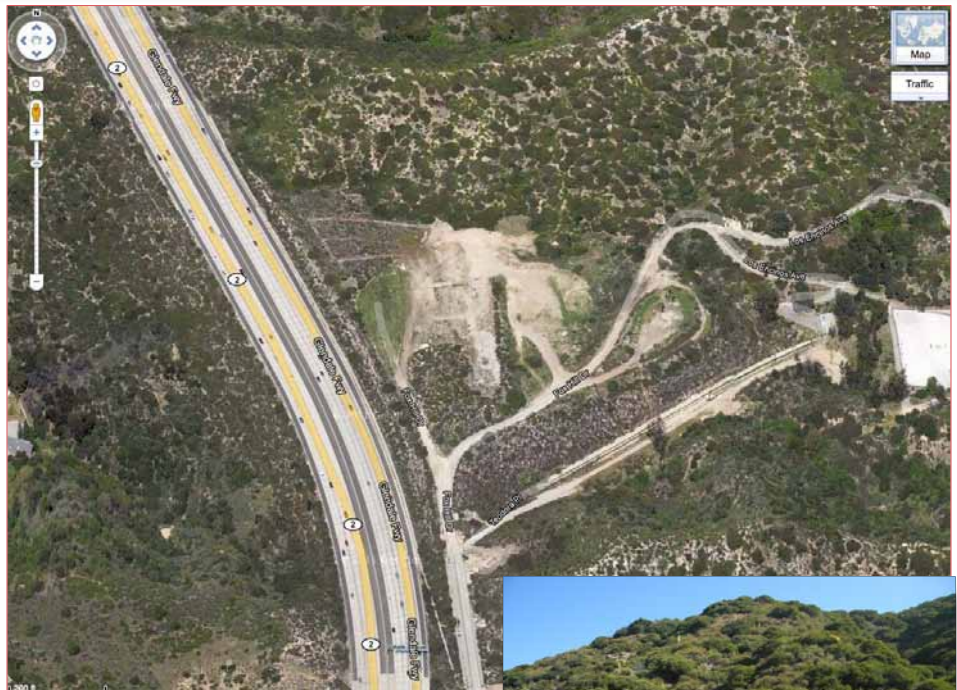
We are not near an airport, but we still have a 400' limitation. We will need to obtain sheds and we can put in solar for power. It is about 1/4 to 1/3 the size of the Basin.

The field will be an AMA sanctioned field and is for member only.

There is the potential that in the future we may be able to get water. There will be port-a-pottys at the field and we will eventually build a shade area with the same design we used for the Balboa park flyer area.

The runway is hard compact fill and will take little work to get into shape.

The club will eventually to do all the improvements. Allowable noise level will be 98 db at 20'. The city of Glendale requires the City's name is in the name of the club, so it will be the **Glendale RC Flyers**.

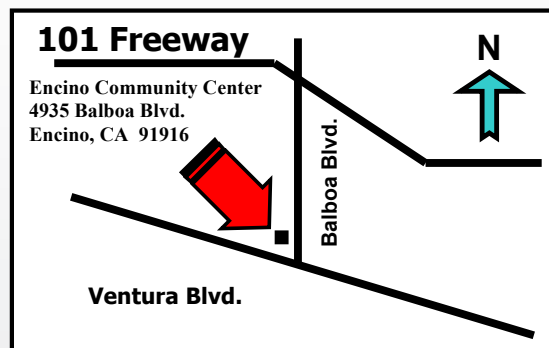
