So you might be wondering what's behind this month's choice? It's not a coincidence that back in the late 70's and early eighties, I obtained my private pilot's license in this little bird, so it has sentimental value to me.

Once licensed, I accumulated some hours in the Cessna 152 and 172 Skyhawk. Cessna 152s produced between 1977 and 1982 were equipped with Lycoming O-235-L2C engines producing 110 hp. This was 10 horse power more than a 150 Continental, which usually had many overhauls under its belt. My first takeoff in a 152 was such a thrill! That Lycoming engine made the 152 just pop of the ground with so much more buoyancy than the 150. Those were some good times! All it takes is one ticket to take this baby home!

There will be no turbines at the Glendale field. Today Jason completed all the work for the Glendale field and has received the key. Annual fees are, Fire Permit is \$148, Use Permit \$250, and there is a \$75 key deposit. The total field fees are





\$398. We will talk to the paving contractor we hired for the runway repairs about a bid for the pit area.

Show and Tell

Adam Gelbart brought in a model of the Fairey Swordfish. The plane was instrumental in the sinking of the Bismark and keeping the Italian navy at bay. It is 84" and will hopefully be powered by an Evolution radial engine, formerly Seidel. It is available from Troy Built models.

Tony Nacarado brought in two foam planes. One is a Russian stealth fighter. They are simple and cheap to build. Tony has already been in dynamic slope soaring. Usually you always fly on the upwind side of the slope. You can fly on the down slope where you dive and fly only 3 to 10 feet above the ground. You gain a lot of speed and at the bottom when you pull up, you get hit powerfully by the down-

draft that actually accelerates



the glider. Downslope gliders are the fastest RC planes and can reach speeds above 400 mph.

There is a new stabilization system for micros that will make flying small micros much more stable. Tony saw it in use on a micro GeeBee where the pilot was flying clean knife edges and smooth controlled landings indoors.

The open house at the site of our new Glendale field is this coming Sat Nov 19 - 9AM to noon. Jason lead the long effort to bring the future home of the "Glendale Flyers" to the point where it can now be developed into a fine AMA flying facility. Have a look for yourself at what needs to be done to achieve the Glendale field's potential at this "open house" for all Valley Flyers members. Again that's this coming Saturday - Nov 19... starting at 9AM.

DIRECTIONS: The field is entered by turning left (north) onto Teodora Place from Fern Lane - directly east of the 2 Glendale Freeway. Here is a link to Google Map instructions to get there from Apollo XI Field. That's using the 101+134. Once you are on North Verdugo Road and then turn on Fern Lane, be sure and watch for the signs to the "Glendale Sports Complex". As soon as Fern Lane takes you under the 2 Freeway, there's an immediate left. That's Teodora Place (gated), which takes you to our new field. (You can change the Google Map settings if you will be coming from the 210).

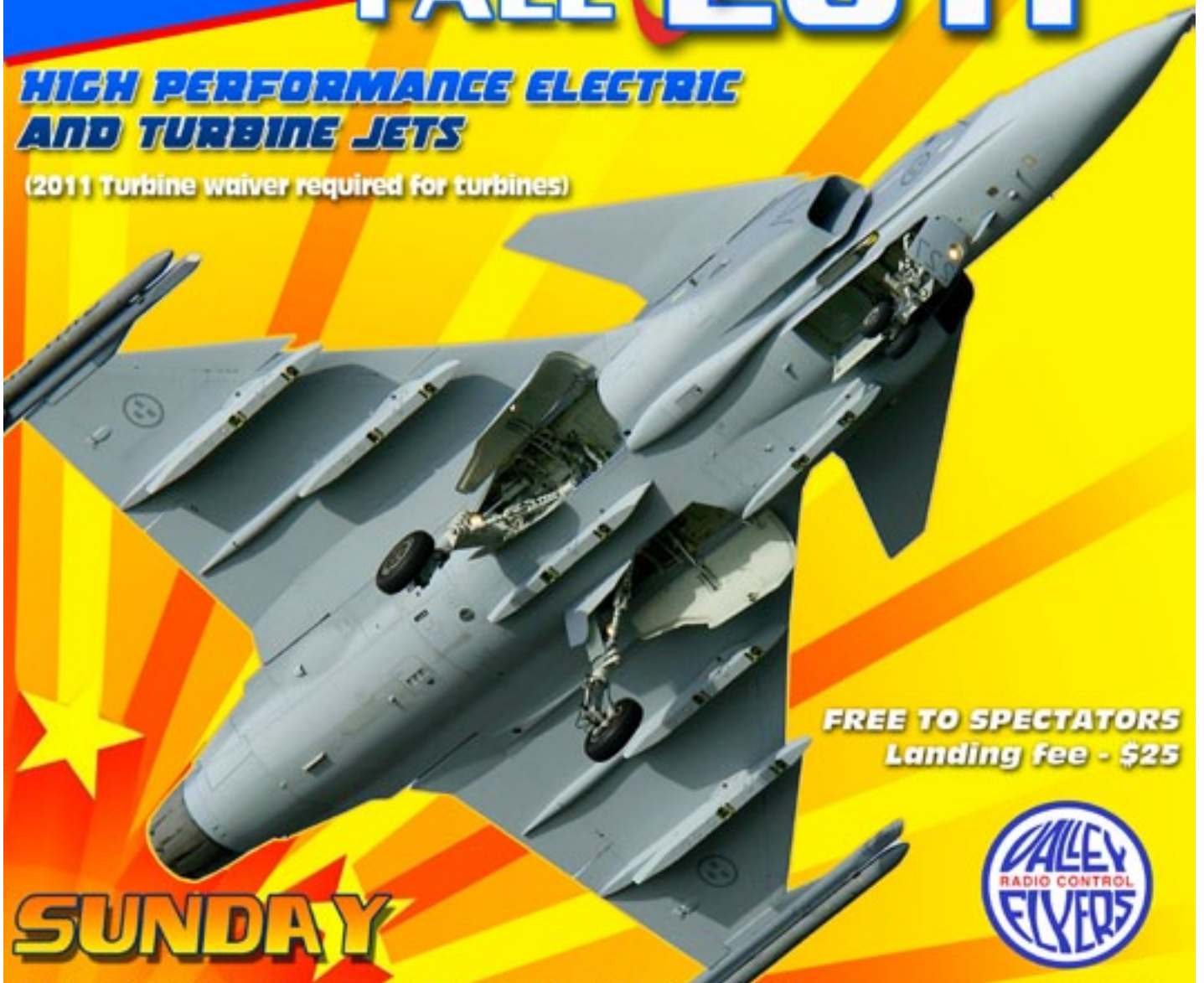

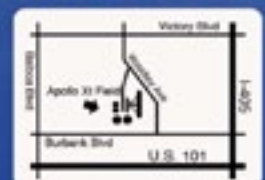

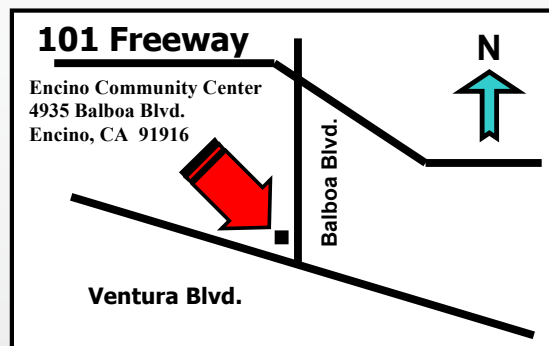
